<b>Course description:</b>	<p>At the beginning of the course will be introduction the soil microbiology. Special emphasis will be given to the Microbiology and biochemistry of xenobiotic compounds degradation; Bioremediation of contaminated soils, and Biological control of soil plant pathogens and nematodes.
